1. Anti-war Slogans

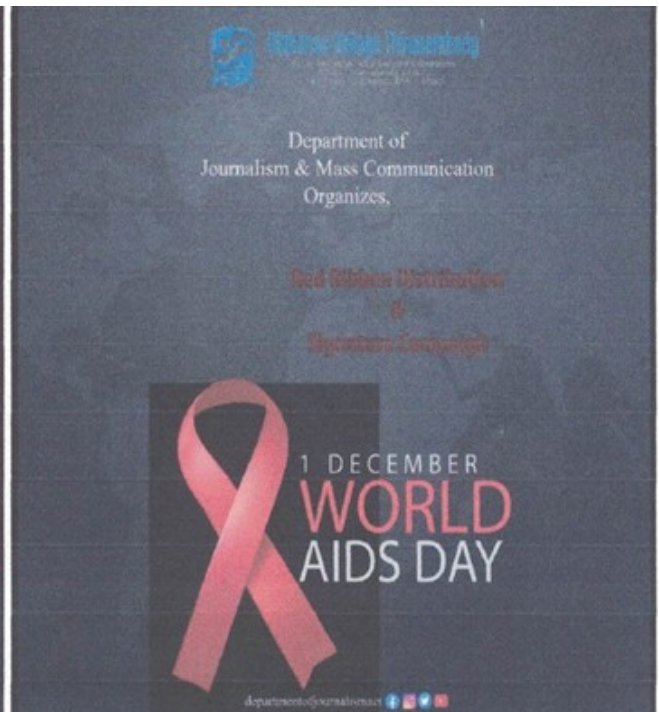
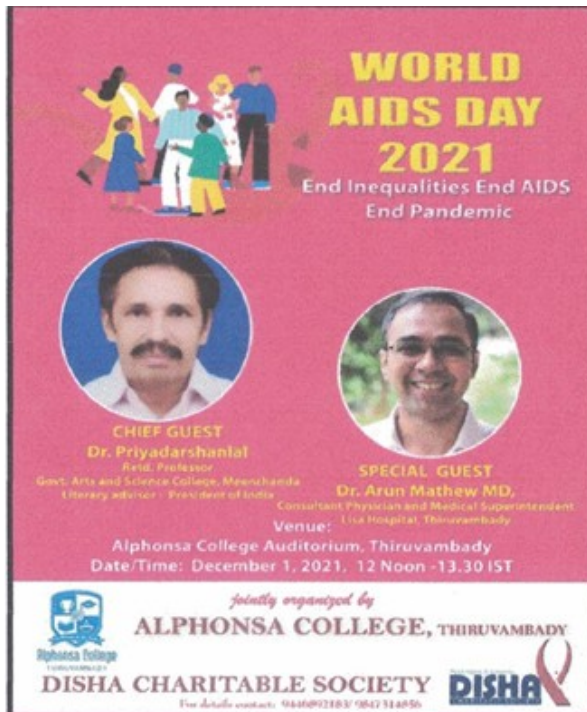
