Listening Skills

Overview

A listening comprehension test is used to assess and evaluate an individual's ability to understand and comprehend spoken English. During the listening comprehension assessment, a candidate hears the recording of different conversations and discussions. The Listening Comprehension section tests your ability to listen for basic interpersonal, instructional and academic purposes. During the test, you will hear recordings of different talks and discussions. Then, following each audio, you will hear a question or a number of questions about what you just heard.

The listening test identifies your ability to understand:

- Main ideas and detailed factual information
- The opinions and attitudes of speakers
- The purpose of an utterance
- The ability to follow the development of ideas.

- The ability to listen independently.

Topics

Module 1.One to one conversation (10 Hours)

Recording 1 - A conversation between two people set in an everyday social context.

Module 2. Monologue (10 Hours)

Recording 2 - A monologue set in an everyday social context, e.g. a speech about local facilities.

Recording 3 - A monologue on an academic subject, e.g. a university lecture

Module3. Group Conversation (10 Hours)

Recording 4 - A conversation between up to four people set in an educational or training context, e.g. a university tutor and a student discussing an assignment.



Course Summary

Listening Skills Good listening skills are not something we are born with. They are habits that we create, starting in our childhood, that are carried with us throughout our adulthood. Listening skill habits can impact every area of one's life, including personal relationships and career. Being a good listener can earn respect, appreciation and help build stronger relationships in social and business dealings.

This course explains the ins and outs of what good listening skills consist of, why they are important and how one can improve them. The course helps to determine what type of listener you are, provides basic skills of listening, barriers to listening, listening habits, body language, and activities to improve listening habits. One can learn the importance of physical attributes, active listening, attitude, perception, bias, language barriers, key gestures, and even how to take good notes.

28 students from 2nd semester attended this 30 hrs course conducted by Ms. Suvarna Gloria Thomas. This enabled them to know the direction to follow to improve listening habits. This course began on 08/10 2017 and ended on 10/11/2017.
